

Wisconsin Man May Drop Bomb

ABOARD USS MT. MCKINLEY AT BIKINI, June 15. (UPI)—Maj. Woodrow P. Swanson, 30, Wisconsin native, was recommended today for the honor of dropping the atomic bomb, the first Bikini test, but Maj. Gen. W. E. Kepner, who has been making final selection until June 21.

Swanson's crew was recommended by Brig. Gen. Roger M. Hamm, commander of task group 1.5 which was charged with delivering the bomb against an array of Navy target ships in Bikini lagoon July 1.

Kepner's choice climaxed four months of competition among four Superjet crews in New Mexico and Kansas.

Withholding Decision

Kepner, deputy commander of joint task force one for aviation, would withhold final selection.

"I will accept the line-up selection after June 20," Kepner said. "I am always considering as available the other crews. If conditions

necessitate a change there are supernumeraries who must be ready and on call."

In nominating Swanson and his crew, Maj. Gen. Harold Wood, 30, Bordentown, N. J., Ramey said all four crews had developed "uncanny skill" in flying at 10,000-foot altitudes and in dropping \$10,000 salaries. House members already receive similar compensation funds.

"Every crew in our competition can consistently drop a bomb within the requirements of 200 yards and 100 feet," said Kepner. "You can consider unfriendly winds, the hundreds of miles connected with each delicate part of a mission, and the above present risk of a man being a crew, this is a record to be proud of."

Tibbets Was Leader

Swanson's nomination was made last night after competitive bomb drops completed yesterday. It was a surprise both among Army air force officers, at Kwajalein and personnel aboard this flagship.

Leader in the competition until the last night was Maj. Gen. Col. Paul Tibbets, Jr., Orlando, Fla., who piloted the Superfort which dropped the atomic bomb on Hiroshima. His bombardier was then Lt. Col. Thomas W. Ferree of Mocksville, N. C. The other crew are led by Lt. Col. Clarence C. McPherson of Cheyenne, Penn.

In addition to above members of Swanson's crew are Capt. William H. Hargrave, Oklahoma City, co-pilot Maj. Will Adams, 31, San Bernardino, Calif., navigator; Capt. Paul Cheever, Jr., 22, Leavenworth, Wyo., statistician; First Lt. James M. Gleason, 24, Akron, S. C., flight engineer; Tech. Sgt. Jack Cochran of Gadsden, Alabama, co-pilot; and Corps. Roland Hodges, 18, Franklin, Tenn., and Herbert B. Lyons, 21, Decatur, Ill., both scanners.
